- Membership Fee(\$5.00) is a once/year fee required for all entrants (Nov 01, 2022- Oct 31, 2023) please see exemptions on page 6
- Entry Forms to be completed prior with exhibit drop-off Friday Sept 08, 2023 at Senior's Centre in Delisle SK.
- Entry tags must be completed prior to dropping off exhibits Fri 5-8 pm
- All exhibits are to be registered on or before Friday evening and entry fee paid.
- **No exhibit will necessarily be awarded a prize** unless deemed worthy by the judge (unless otherwise specified, judges may adjust prizes)
- **Prize Money awarded Saturday 4-5 pm**

The Shand Greenhouse has grown and distributed over 12.5 million seedlings to date. Various groups, environmental agencies and our customers plant our seedlings each year. The seedlings are mainly used to:

- Help our rural customers to establish shelterbelts on their own properties
- Help create habitat for wildlife in conservation projects

To grow the seedlings year-round, we use waste heat from the adjoining Shand Power Station. This heats the Shand Greenhouse and allows us to offset our emissions generated by the burning of fossil fuels.

## Roots, Vegetables and Fruits - Tips for Exhibiting

**Beets**—Medium sized roots, deep red colour throughout. They should be free from white rings. Uniformity in the group is important. Tops should be removed 1/2 inch

**Cabbage**— Heads should be solid, free from insect damage and cracks and not

**Carrots**— uniform, clean (not scrubbed), free from sunburn, discolouration and side

**Cauliflower**— Leaves should be cut off level with the top of head. The curd should

**Corn**— should be uniform in size and shown in the husk

**Onions**— Medium sized with matured bulbs. Roots and tops should be trimmed

**Parsnips**—Trim off side roots and tops to 1/2 inch above crown.

**Potatoes**—Extra-large potatoes frequently have hollow hearts. Medium-sized, uniform tubers free from disease and insect damage and with shallow eyes are more

**Rhubarb**—Stalks uniform. The leaf blade should be trimmed to leave about one inch in a fan shape. The stalk is left intact as pulled from plant except any loose

**Tomatoes**—All tomatoes should be shown with stems on. Uniformity is important.

**Turnips**—Trim of side roots and tops to 1/2 inch above crown.

**Zucchini**—Should be 12 inches or under
