Roots, Vegetables and Fruits - Tips for Exhibiting

Beets—Medium sized roots, deep red colour throughout. They should be free from white rings. Uniformity in the group is important. Tops should be

Cabbage— Heads should be solid, free from insect damage and cracks

Carrots— uniform, clean (not scrubbed), free from sunburn, discolouration

Cauliflower— Leaves should be cut off level with the top of head. The curd

Corn— should be uniform in size and shown in the husk

Onions— Medium sized with matured bulbs. Roots and tops should be

Parsnips—Trim off side roots and tops to 1/2 inch above crown.

Potatoes—Extra-large potatoes frequently have hollow hearts. Medium-sized, uniform tubers free from disease and insect damage and with shal-

Rhubarb—Stalks uniform. The leaf blade should be trimmed to leave about one inch in a fan shape. The stalk is left intact as pulled from plant except

Tomatoes—All tomatoes should be shown with stems on.
Uniformity is important.

Turnips—Trim of side roots and tops to 1/2 inch above crown.

Zucchini—Should be 12 inches or under
